Competition rules:

IARU Region 1 Rules for Championships in Amateur Radio Direction Finding (Part A and Part B), version 2018, apply.

The event is organized with the kind support of Lesy České republiky and the town Doksy.









Transport during championship:

Bulk transport (buses) to start and from (to) finish areas will be arranged for all competitors and team officials (the competitors and team officials are **obliged to wear badges**). Visitors are allowed at the finish area only. They will be transported separately by bus or can travel on their own. Location of the finish area will be announced in advance on the event website and at information table.

Ban on most telecommunication equipment:

Please be reminded that most of the telecommunication equipment is forbidden in the competitions and start areas, including (but not limited to) mobile phones, wireless headphones, WiFi-enabled cameras, advanced smartwatches, etc.

Anti-doping regulations:

We follow WADA anti-doping regulations. Please, bear in mind that WADA on-site check may occur.

Marking device:

SportIdent system will be used. Only regular SI cards are allowed — tCard and pCard will not work. If you are not sure, please, refer to the office. We will supply you with another one.



Starting group allocations:

Allocation of competitors to start groups **for ALL competitions** shall be handed over (i.e., fill particular slots with names/start numbers) to the office **not later than by 15.00 of the arrival day (Saturday)**. Later allocations will not be taken into account — account — competitors will be allocated according to the registration form. That will allow smooth preparation of starting lists that should be ready for the team leaders meetings.

Various info:

- On Sunday & Monday there will be separate newsletters released including latest results, start list and details on competition for the following day.
- You've received stickers (with start No.) for receivers—each receiver (even spare ones) shall have the sticker.
- Hotel address and phone number to WYAC hotline is printed on both receiver stickers and maps.
- The numbers of transmitters to be searched for are printed on maps for each category.
- There will be plastic bags at the start for transferring luggage to the finish area (you may use spare stickers with your start number to mark your bag).
- Please, keep in mind that finish Beacon (B) works as a regular control and shall be marked and that finish time is recorded when you punch finish station.
- Note you'll need to wear your badge to access buses and animation program.

Instructions for competitions

CLASSIC No. 1

Date: **Sunday — July 1, 2018.**

Map: IOF standard, 1:10 000, contour interval 5 m, size 384×213 mm, status: spring 2018.

Map is printed on waterproof paper.

Start, beacon and finish will be shown on sample maps in pre-start area. Competitor enters this area 10 minutes prior to their start time.

The receivers, including spare ones (all marked with stickers), will be handed over just after reaching start area. It will be organized separately country by country. Spare receivers (clearly indicating the team) will be collected and placed at the starting line.

In the pre-start area, competitor can prepare your map on tables: sticky tapes, scissors and markers will be available. Start, finish, 400 m and 500 m circles, and finish corridor ARE NOT preprinted on maps — competitors must do that by their own.

Start corridors: 150 m single-sided.

Start interval is 5 minutes.

Finish corridor: 150 m, last 30 m double-sided uninterrupted from the beacon to the finish line.

Finish: Close to the village of Srní.

Time limit: 150 minutes.





- RF power 3 W,
- frequency: TX 1–5: MOE–MO5 3.550 MHz, finish beacon: MO 3.600 MHz,
- antenna: 8 m vertical + 8 m single straight radial counterpoise.

Instructions for competitions

SPRINT

Date: Monday — July 2, 2018.

Map: IOF standard, 1:5 000, contour interval 5 m, size A4, status: spring 2018.

Map is printed on waterproof paper.

Start, spectator control, beacon, and finish will be shown on sample maps in prestart area. The competitor enters the pre-start area 2 minutes prior to their start time. However, they will be called in 4 minutes prior to their start time.

The receivers, including spare ones (all marked with stickers), will be handed over just after reaching start area. It will be organized separately country by country. Spare receivers (clearly indicating the team) will be collected and placed at the starting line.

In the pre-start area, you can prepare your map on tables: sticky tapes, scissors and pens will be available. Spectator control, beacon, and finish corridor ARE preprinted on maps.

Start corridors: 30 m single-sided.

Start interval is 2 minutes. However, some categories will be shifted by one minute — see starting list.

Spectator's corridor: 100 m, begins at the spectators control and leads you towards the area of second loop. **Remember, it is obligatory!**

Finish corridor: 300 m, last 100 m double-sided uninterrupted from the beacon to the finish line.

Finish: Close to event center.

Time limit: 60 minutes.

Water will be available in both start and finish areas.

Team leaders will be transported from start to finish. The departures will be announced in the start area.

There will be a small buffet in the finish area serving beverages.


SPRINT 3.5 MHz transmitters:

- RF power: 1 W,
- Antenna: 8m vertical + 8 m single radial counterpoise,
- Frequency: TX 1–5: MOE–MO5 (keying speed 50 PARIS) 3.530 MHz,


Spectators control: S (keying speed 50 PARIS) 3.550 MHz, TX 1F–5F: MOE–MO5 (keying speed 70 PARIS) 3.570 MHz, Finish beacon: MO (keying speed 50 PARIS) 3.600 MHz.

(Required 30 kHz channel spacing is reduced in order to comply with the national regulations and the Rules.)

Instructions for competitions

CLASSIC No. 2

Date: Tuesday — July 3, 2018.

Map: IOF standard, 1:15 000, contour interval 5 m, size A4, status: spring 2018.

Map is printed on waterproof paper.

Start, beacon and finish will be shown on sample maps in pre-start area which competitor enters 10 minutes prior to their start time.

The receivers, including spare ones (all marked with stickers), will be handed over just after reaching start area. It will be organized separately country by country. Spare receivers (clearly indicating the team) will be collected and placed at the starting line.

In prestart area, you can prepare your map on tables: sticky tapes, scissors and markers will be available. Start, finish, 400 m and 500 m circles, and finish corridor ARE NOT preprinted on maps — competitors must do that by their own.

Start corridors: 100 m single-sided.

Start interval is 5 minutes.

Finish corridor: 250 m, last 100 m double-sided uninterrupted from the beacon to the finish line.

Finish: Close to event center.

Time limit: 150 minutes.


Team leaders will be transported from start to finish. The departures will be announced in the start area.

There will be a small buffet in the finish area serving beverages.


144 MHz transmitters:

- frequency: TX 1–5: MOE–MO5 144.500 MHz, finish beacon: MO 144.850 MHz,
- antenna: crossed dipoles 2.5 m above the ground level.
