



Training camp:

Wednesday	August 12	Sprint
Thursday	August 13	3,5 MHz
Friday	August 14	144 MHz
Saturday	August 15	Foxoring

Note:

-The training session will only be organized if we have requests for a minimum of 50 participants;

-Accommodation can only be provided upon request at the Valahia Hotel (25 euro/person/night, rooms 2 beds) or at smaller rates at a boarding school (12 euro/person/night, rooms 3-4 beds).

Tuesday	August 18, 1st Classics, awarding ceremony (foxoring and 1st classics);

Thursday	August 20, 2nd Classics;
Friday	August 21, Sprint, awarding (2nd classics, sprint) and closing ceremony;

1st classics: 3,5 MHz (W19, W21, W35, M19, M21, M40)
144 MHz (W45, W55, W65, M50, M60, M70)

2nd classics: 144 MHz (W19, W21, W35, M19, M21, M40)
3.5 MHz (W45, W55, W65, M50, M60, M70)

Categories:

According to the Rules: W19 , W21, W35, W45, W55, W65, M19, M21, M40, M50, M60, M70.

Ranking:

Individual for each category and each competition, team ranking for each category for the two classics. Competitors at 1-3 places will be awarded with medals and certificates.

Transmitters and antennas:

3.5 MHz transmitters for foxoring (continuous)

RF power: field transmitters = 10 mW, finish beacon = 1W;

Antennas: field transmitters = 30 cm vertical (no counterpoise);
finish beacon = 8m vertical + 4x2m radials counterpoise;

Frequency: 3.530 MHz ... TX 1, 2, 1F, 2F, (MOE, MOI);
3.550 MHz ... TX 3, 4, 3F, 4F, (MOS, MOH);
3.570 MHz ... TX 5, 5F, (MO5);
3.600 MHz ... Finish beacon: (MO);

TX 1-5, finish beacon: keying speed 50 PARIS / TX 1F-5F: keying speed 70 PARIS.

3.5 MHz transmitters (classic)

RF power: 3W;

Antenna: 8m vertical + 4x2m radials counterpoise;

Frequency: 3.530 MHz ... TX 1-5;
3.600 MHz ... Finish beacon

144 MHz transmitters (classic)

RF power: 1W;

Antenna: turnstill, 3 m above ground level;

Frequency: 144.500 MHz ... TX 1-5;
144.900 MHz ... Finish beacon.

3.5 MHz transmitters for Sprint (1 minute cycle - 12s:48s)

RF power: 1W;

Antenna: 8m vertical + 4x2m radials counterpoise;

Frequency: 3.530 MHz ... TX 1-5 keying speed 50 PARIS;
3.550 MHz ... spectators control S keying speed 50 PARIS;
3.570 MHz ... TX F1-F5 keying speed 70 PARIS;
3.600 MHz ... Finish beacon keying speed 50 PARIS;

Flags:

Foxoring: standard 30x30 cm 3-sided white and orange flag at B (beacon) control. No flag at all other controls.

Classic 3.5 MHz: standard 30x30 cm 3-sided white and orange flag at all controls;

Classic 144 MHz: standard 30x30 cm 3-sided white and orange flag with a blue vertical stripe at all controls;

Sprint: standard 30x30 cm 3-sided white and orange flag at S (spectator) and B (beacon) controls. Red/white striped SI stand (no flag) at all other controls

Marking device:

SportIdent at all controls (NOT in the AIR mode), control numbers and bands are written on the SI units.

Note:

Note on use of GPS devices: The use of satellite positioning devices is allowed provided they do not contain digital map of the terrain.

Note on thunderstorm: In a case of a severe thunderstorm, the Chairman of the Jury may recall the competition (27.5 of the Rules). The competitors shall set for the finish immediately.

Insurance and Medical Care: First aid facility will be available at the finish areas for all competitions. No cost to the participant applies for on-site minor treatment; however, the cost for ambulance transportation, emergency department visits, and clinic visits will be the participant's responsibility. Thus, we recommend you to purchase an insurance covering such expenses.

Terrain characteristics, clothing, weather:

The terrain is hilly, characterized largely by sparse forest alternating with open meadow areas. In certain sections, the vegetation becomes denser, forming thickets that may make movement more difficult. The area is crossed by a welldeveloped network of trails.

In August, the average temperature is approximately 22°C, with frequent daytime highs of 27–29°C and nighttime lows of 16–18°C.

Regarding precipitation, August is generally stable and predominantly sunny. There is a possibility of short showers or summer storms, but these are usually isolated and of short duration.

Land dominated by hills and plains with a good network of paths and various open spaces.

Classic - IOF, 1:10000

Foxoring - IOF, 1:10000

Sprint - IOF, 1:5000



Fees:

Entry fee Region 1/European ARDF Championships:

Competitors: 50 EUR/person/competition (4 x 50 = 200EUR for all);

Team officials and visitors: 25 EUR/person/competition (4 x 25 = 100EUR for all);

It is NOT allowed to use your own transportation to travel to the start of any Region 1 / European ARDF Championships competition.

Entry fee Training camp:

Competitors: 20 EUR/pers/competition (4 x 20 = 80 EUR for all);

Team officials and visitors: 10 EUR/person/competition (4 x 10 = 40 EUR for all);

Number of team officials per team is not limited.

Accommodation and Board:

Region 1/European ARDF Championships: 500 EUR per whole event
Hamfest fee for those not staying at Hotel Valahia: 25 EURO.

For training camp see section „Event programme” (six days accommodation and meals at a three-star hotel with hamfest);
Hamfest fee for those not staying at Hotel Valahia: 25 euro/person.

Training camp (we have two options):

- Valahia Hotel (25 euro/person/night, rooms 2 beds). Meals can be ordered at the hotel restaurant;
- Boarding school (12 euro/person/night, rooms 3-4 beds). Meals can be served in a catering mode (~20euro/day three meals on order);
- Payment for those registered for the training camp can also be made upon arrival in Târgoviște, without increase.

For late payments, an additional charge 30% of the entry fees will be applied.





